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The project entailed restoration of the building's main entrance and brick repointing for this prominent building in an urban area near the heart of the Capitol Hill Historic District and along the Pennsylvania Avenue commercial corridor in South-East Washington.

David Bell was one of the preservation architects working in conjunction with the 'Friends of the Old Naval Hospital'. They conducted secondary-source research and on-site investigation of the building to identify historic resources, condition, determine preservation zones in preparation for future work in determining treatment and use.



BELLArchitects was hired to create restoration documents for the exterior stair and main entrance portico facing south and brick repointing work near the 'moat' around the perimeter of the main building. Currently we are working on the restoration package and utilizing on-site investigation and photographic evidence to recreate and restore portions of the building to their configuration from the turn of the 20th century.
